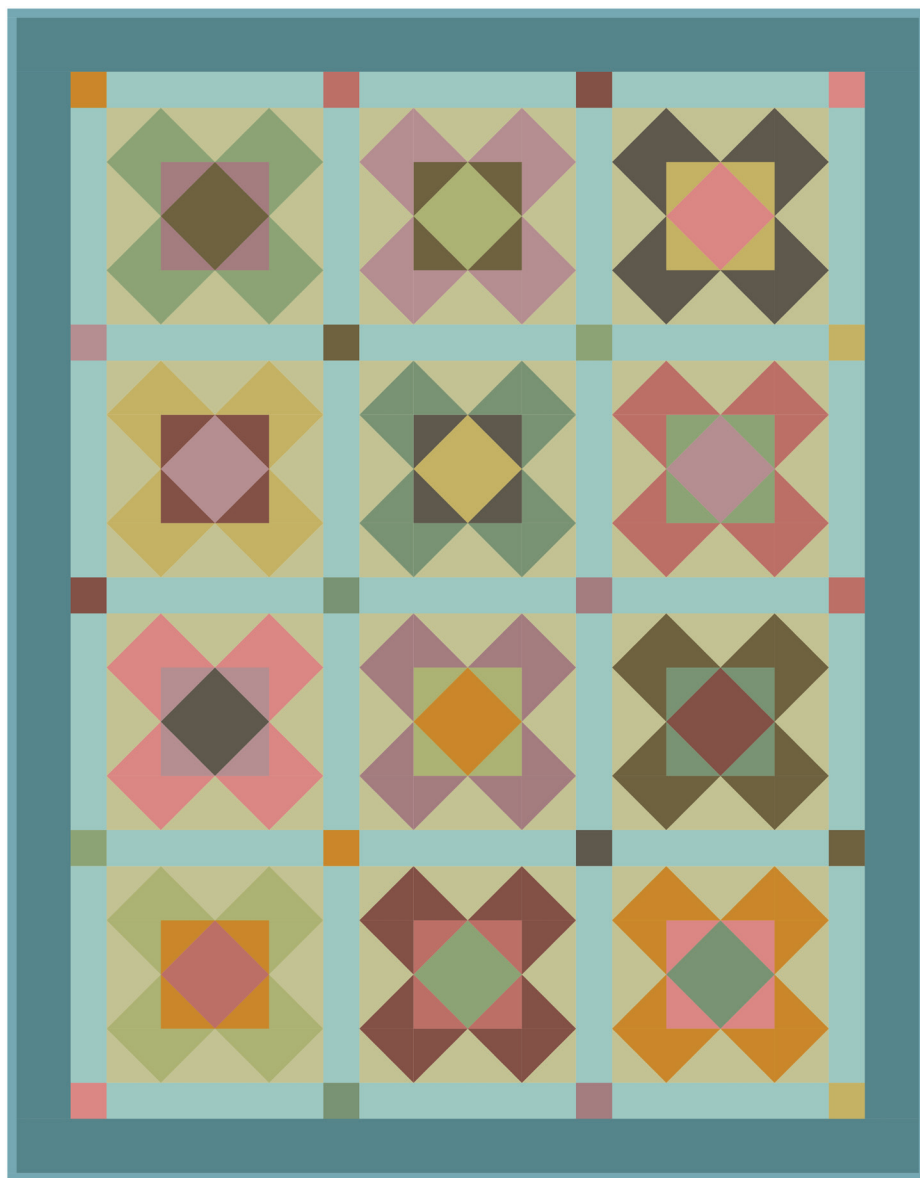

Quilt Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. Borders are cut to exact length required plus $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance on each end. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42" wide).

Fabric A From each of the (12) Fat Quarters cut:
(1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " square
(2) $3\frac{7}{8}$ " squares
(12) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares
(2) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.
Note: You will have extra $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Fabric B Cut (3) $3\frac{7}{8}$ " WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (24) $3\frac{7}{8}$ " squares.
Cut (8) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (48) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

Fabric C Cut (11) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (31) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $12\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

Fabric D Cut (4) 4" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 4" x $58\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
Cut (3) 4" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 4" x $51\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

Binding Cut (7) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips.

Backing Cut (2) 59" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to make (1) 59" x 73" backing.

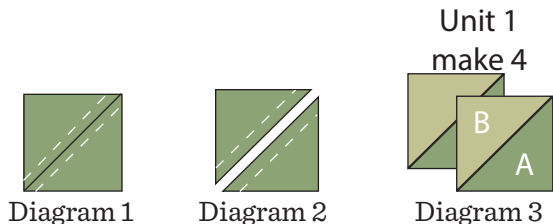

Making the Quilt

Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Block Assembly

Pull (2) matching $3\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric A squares and (2) matching $3\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric B squares. Place (1) $3\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric A square on top of (1) $3\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric B square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Diagram 1). Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Diagram 1). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Diagram 2) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to make (2) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 1 squares (Diagram 3). Repeat to make (4) matching Unit 1 squares total.



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2. Pull (8) matching $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A squares of the same color used in Step 1. Place (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square on the left side of (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip, right sides together (Diagram 4). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Diagram 4). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance (Diagram 5).

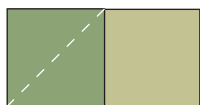

3. Place another $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square on the right side of the $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip, right sides together (Diagram 6). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Diagram 6). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 2 strip (Diagram 7).

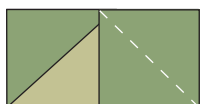

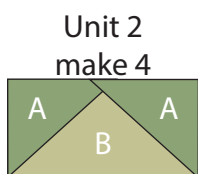

5. Pull (4) matching $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A squares different from the color pulled in Step 1. Pull (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square different from the previous colors. Place (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square on the top left corner of (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square, right sides together (Diagram 8). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Diagram 8). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Diagram 9). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn seam.

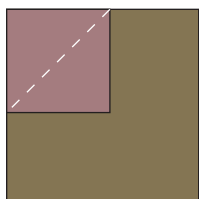

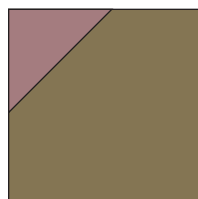

6. Follow Diagram 10 for the seam direction to add a $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square to each of the remaining corners of the $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 3 square (Diagram 11).

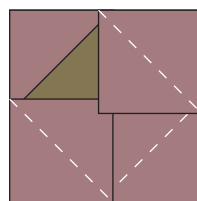

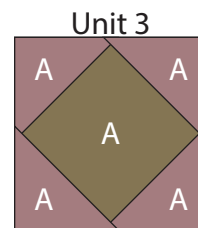

7. Sew (1) Unit 1 square to each end of (1) Unit 2 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 2 strip to each side of the Unit 3 square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) $12\frac{1}{2}$ " Block One square (Diagram 12).

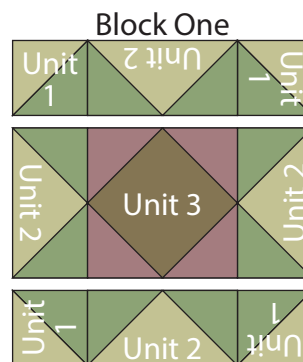

8. Repeat Steps 1-7 to make an additional (11) Block One squares.

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9. Sew together (4) 2 ½" Fabric A squares and (3) 2 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric C strips, end to end and alternating them from left to right, to make Row One (Diagram 13). Repeat to make Row Three, Row Five, Row Seven and Row Nine.
10. Sew together (4) 2 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric C strips and (3) Block One squares, alternating them from left to right, to make Row Two (Diagram 13). Repeat to make Row Four, Row Six and Row Eight.
11. Sew together the (9) pieced Rows, lengthwise and in numerical order from the top to bottom, to make the 44 ½" x 58 ½" Quilt Center (Diagram 13).

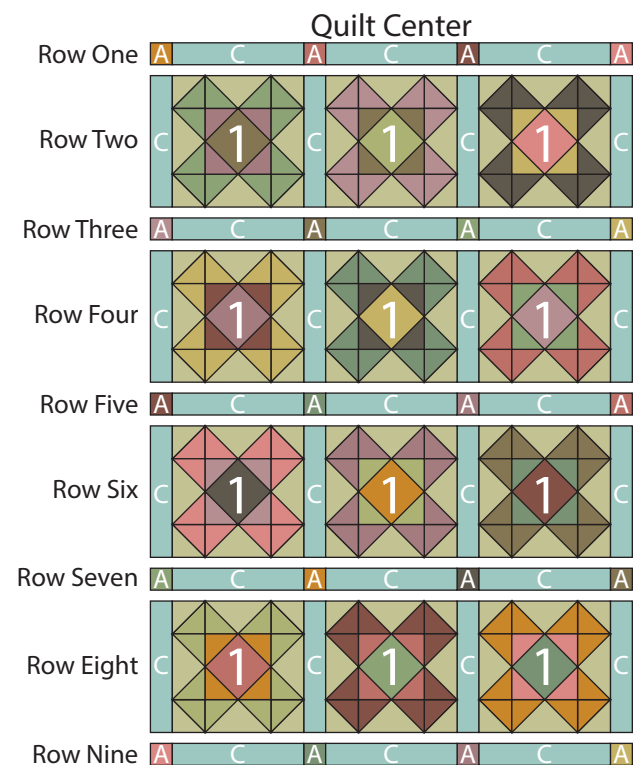
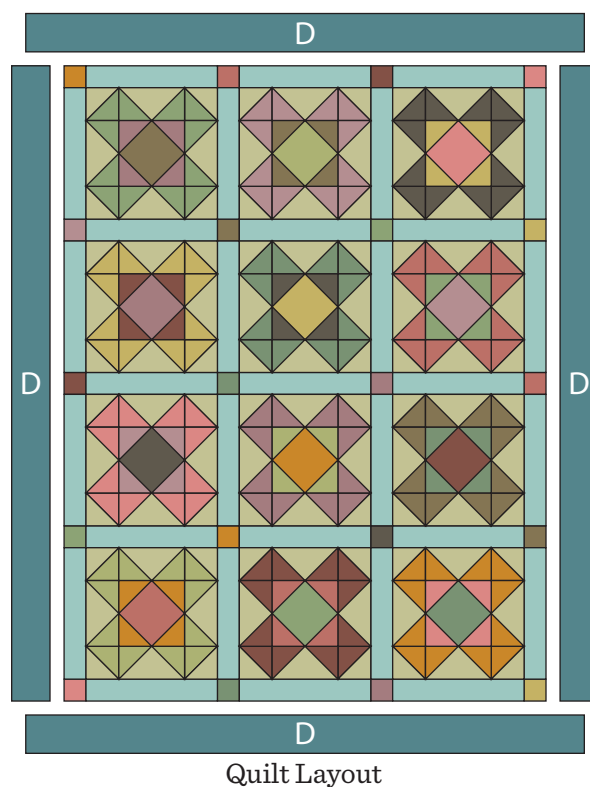

Quilt Top Assembly

(Refer to the Quilt Layout when assembling the quilt top.)

12. Sew (1) 4" x 58 ½" Fabric D strip to each side of the Quilt Center. Sew (1) 4" x 51 ½" Fabric D strip to the top and bottom of the Quilt Center to make the Quilt Top.
13. Layer and quilt as desired.
14. Sew the (7) binding strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
15. Bind as desired.
